The vision of establishing Learning Point Foundation was driven by our aspiration to create an institution that enables individuals to achieve their full potential through education and all-round development. Our main mission revolves around providing exceptional opportunities to students, with a specific focus on prioritizing the education, counseling, and training of teachers and women. Since our inception in 2018, we have tirelessly worked towards serving underprivileged members of society and economically disadvantaged areas in North Bangalore.

One of the key initiatives we have undertaken at our center is providing high-quality education to dropouts through the innovative NIOS system. This empowers these students to successfully complete their 10th and 12th standard exams, and we also encourage them to pursue higher education through regular educational systems. Moreover, we actively assist these students in finding employment opportunities through our dedicated employment center, LP Jobs, and Spoken English training. We firmly believe in transforming lives through education and employment and are fully committed to making a positive impact on society.



ACHIEVEMENTS



- 1. Brought 438 Dropouts back to the fold of education:** Over the last 4 years, we have taught and enabled 438 dropouts to complete their NIOS, with an additional 300+ enrolled currently. Of these, 52% are girls.
- 2. Stupendous 96% Pass Rate in NIOS:** By the grace of the Almighty, we have achieved an outstanding 96% Pass rate for NIOS 10th and 12th over the last 4 years.
- 3. Inclusive Success:** Our students transcend age limitations, and belong to marginalized groups, including single mothers, Madrasa students, breadwinners, widows, and orphans.
- 4. Cambridge Certification Classes:** Skillfully provided Cambridge certification classes to the youth, culminating in job placements upon successful exam completion.
- 5. Empowering Through Employment:** Facilitated the transformation of 1306 candidates' lives through tailored job training, resulting in substantial 77% job placements.

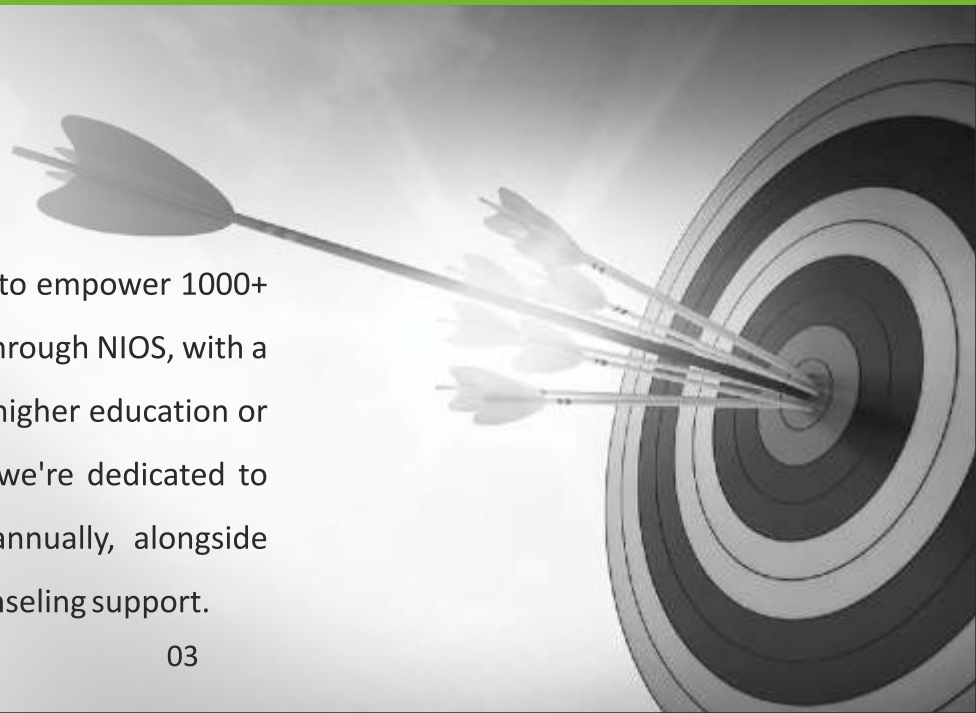

Unfolding the Story of Our Founder's Journey"



Nearly a decade ago, our founder, **Mrs. Sarvath Adil Khan**, began her journey in the field of social service. Originating from Hoskote Taluk, Bengaluru. She developed a deep empathy for the underprivileged and their struggles.

Mrs. Khan recognized that the core of their problems was the lack of education. Illiteracy left these disadvantaged individuals without suitable job opportunities and their poverty often prevented them from pursuing education or sending their children to schools.

Faced with these issues, Mrs. Khan decided to take on the challenge of empowering the needy. She started visiting local government schools, motivating students to pursue their education and providing English language training.

Her focus didn't only revolve around children's education; she counseled their parents as well, pushing them for a life transformation. She aimed to raise their living standards by promoting general awareness about different opportunities and a better way of life.

Despite having paused her own education after 2nd PUC due to marriage, Mrs. Khan later resumed her studies. Today, she holds a master's degree in psychology and is concurrently pursuing a Ph.D. in educational psychology.

She understood the obstacles faced by educational dropouts as she has experienced this gap in her own education. This experience spurred her to establish an academy that could support these individuals directly; hence the Learning Point Foundation was founded in 2018.

Mrs. Khan has been a remarkable inspiration and role model to students and teachers alike. As a certified Cambridge trainer, she has provided comprehensive training to several Cambridge certification aspirants, thereby transforming the lives of hundreds of students and teachers.

Despite navigating an array of complex challenges, Mrs. Khan has effectively guided numerous students at the Learning Point Foundation towards success. This achievement owes much to the remarkable generosity and steadfast support exhibited by numerous benefactors. THE LIFELINE FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM.

This test will provide valuable insights to guide individualized plans for each student, regardless of their grade or abilities. The students exhibited outstanding English skills and displayed a level of confidence that exceeded that of regular school or college students. The feedback received from both the Lifeline team and the externals was highly positive and remarkable.



On March 4th, Lifeline organized an event to honor students who excelled in both written and oral tests, as well as interviews. Certificates were awarded to these students, along with various goodies as a token of appreciation. During the event, heartfelt gratitude was expressed towards the trainers for their dedicated efforts in supporting the students to achieve their current level. The trainers were also recognized and presented with tokens of appreciation.

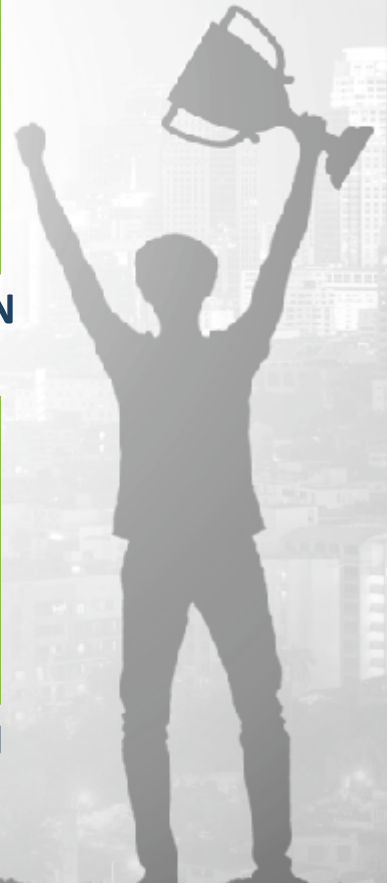

NIOS: Alternate Schooling

A bright and intelligent student has to leave home to go to school. In a world where poverty is rampant, it is not uncommon for a child of migratory parents who are construction workers and a mother who has to work to support the family to be sent to a boarding school. The child is often away from home for long periods of time, missing out on the love and care of their parents. This is a harsh reality for many children in India. Learning Point Foundation (LPF) is a non-profit organization that provides an alternative schooling system for such children. LPF's Open Basic Education Programme (OBEP) is a 12th standard program that allows students to complete their education from home. The program is designed to be flexible and to accommodate the needs of students who are unable to attend a traditional school. LPF provides a safe and supportive learning environment where students can learn at their own pace and receive the attention they need to succeed. The program is available to students from all over India and is a great option for those who are unable to attend a traditional school. LPF is committed to providing quality education to all students, regardless of their background or circumstances. The program is a testament to the power of education to transform lives and create a better future for all.

degree course through correspondence from JNU, Madras and Udu University, Hyderabad, Anna Mills, and Aligarh Muslim University even offer lateral entry.



Learning Point Foundation, a Bangalore based NGO located in Tannery Road and headed by Mrs. Sarvath Adil Khan has been striving to facilitate school dropouts and single mothers/widows from the lower rung of society to complete their elementary education through NIOS. Consequently to the pandemic, there has been an increase in school dropouts due to the loss of jobs of parents. This institution provides a platform for the poor to continue to gain their livelihood and yet continue their studies. Learning Point also provides formal schooling (10th and 12th) through NIOS to Madrasa students without disturbing the structured system they learn at the madrasa. Mrs. Sarvath Adil Khan, Managing Director, told this writer that Learning Point had facilitated

more than 400 Mother and Adolescent in getting their Secondary/ Senior Secondary education. With many teachers in their ranks, Learning Point Foundation provides a learning facility for NIOS subjects. Presently, more than 100 dropout students from schools and madrasas are pursuing their studies under the NIOS education system.

A call to Madrasa Educational Institutions
 Madrasa based educational institutions imparting formal education under the State Board or ICSE or CBSE pattern could also become accredited institutions and Study Centres under the NIOS system. And this provide alternate schooling to dropouts, weak students, and students with learning difficulties. Lack of learning facilities is one of the reasons for many students, including Madrasa students, not enrolling in the NIOS system. If Madrasa managed educational institutions additionally offer NIOS pattern of education, many nearby Madrasa will find it convenient to send the benefit of this schooling. With their existing infrastructure and teaching faculty, it will not be difficult for them to do so. Of course, this may not be a very paying proposition, but they too have a social obligation to fulfill.

One of the highlights of open learning through NIOS is the freedom to choose subjects according to one's needs. For the X and XII standards, Madrasa students may find it convenient to choose Urdu and Arabic in the language category. They have to select a minimum of five subjects of their choice out of 27 subjects. They have to choose three other general subjects. Once they complete their X and XII examinations, the students would open up, offering plenty of higher education and career-building opportunities. They can either continue for the regular degree course or register for a

EDUCATING THE NEEDY & ENSURING PLACEMENTS: LEARNING POINT FOUNDATION SENDS OUT A MESSAGE

Learning Point Foundation is a center for learning, specially designed to teach the youth belonging to socio-economically deprived communities. The center focuses on the development of such communities to achieve intellectual, personal and professional growth that was hindered due to poverty, drug abuse and tragedies.

The center started with six students during its formative years but over the course of four years, the educational institute has 250 odd students enrolled and over 100 or more candidates have been placed in various organizations.

Founder of the Learning Point Foundation, Sarvath Adil Khan shares her incredible story of being empowered and with many others who have been touched by her learning centers.

"We at Learning Point focus on reorienting and transforming a person so they can escape poverty once and for all. We equip them with the knowledge and resources to finally get back to books and do well for themselves", she said.

Sarvath had a story to narrate and she said, "I had to quit studies after my second year at Pre University and subsequently got married at a young age. I resumed work after giving birth to two children, after which I got some clarity about what I wanted to do, which was social work and building an educated society. I visited many government schools and encouraged youth to get educated during my initial days."

The institute is a jumpstart for anyone with minimal resources wanting to get rid of the hardships of poverty. "In the beginning, I had some funding, from a 2 BHK, and we moved into a two-story building to accommodate the current strength that is growing each day. I reached out to a few NGOs urging them to stop donating food as it increases domestic violence and lethargy, instead giving them a chance to be educated. Although they liked the model we follow at Learning Point and want to implement it for them they have failed to provide me with clarity on my venture."

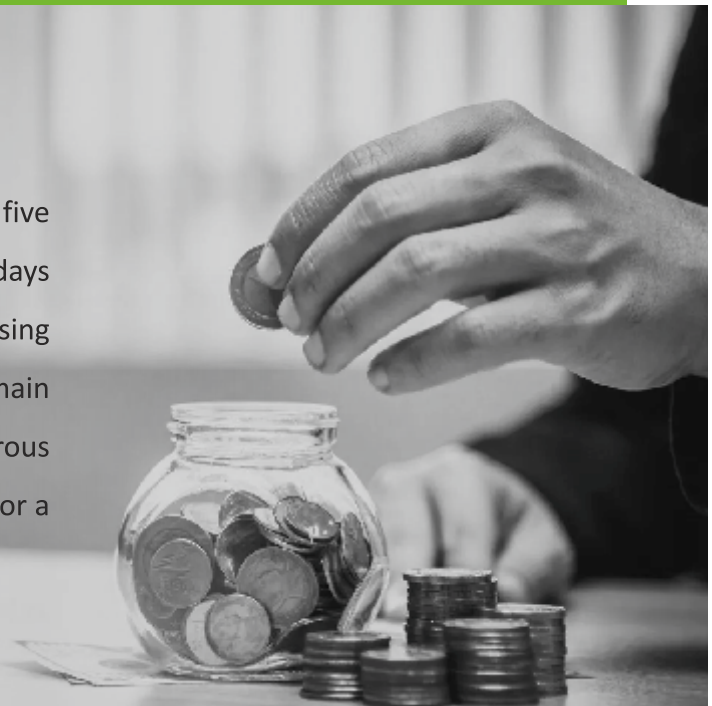

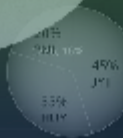

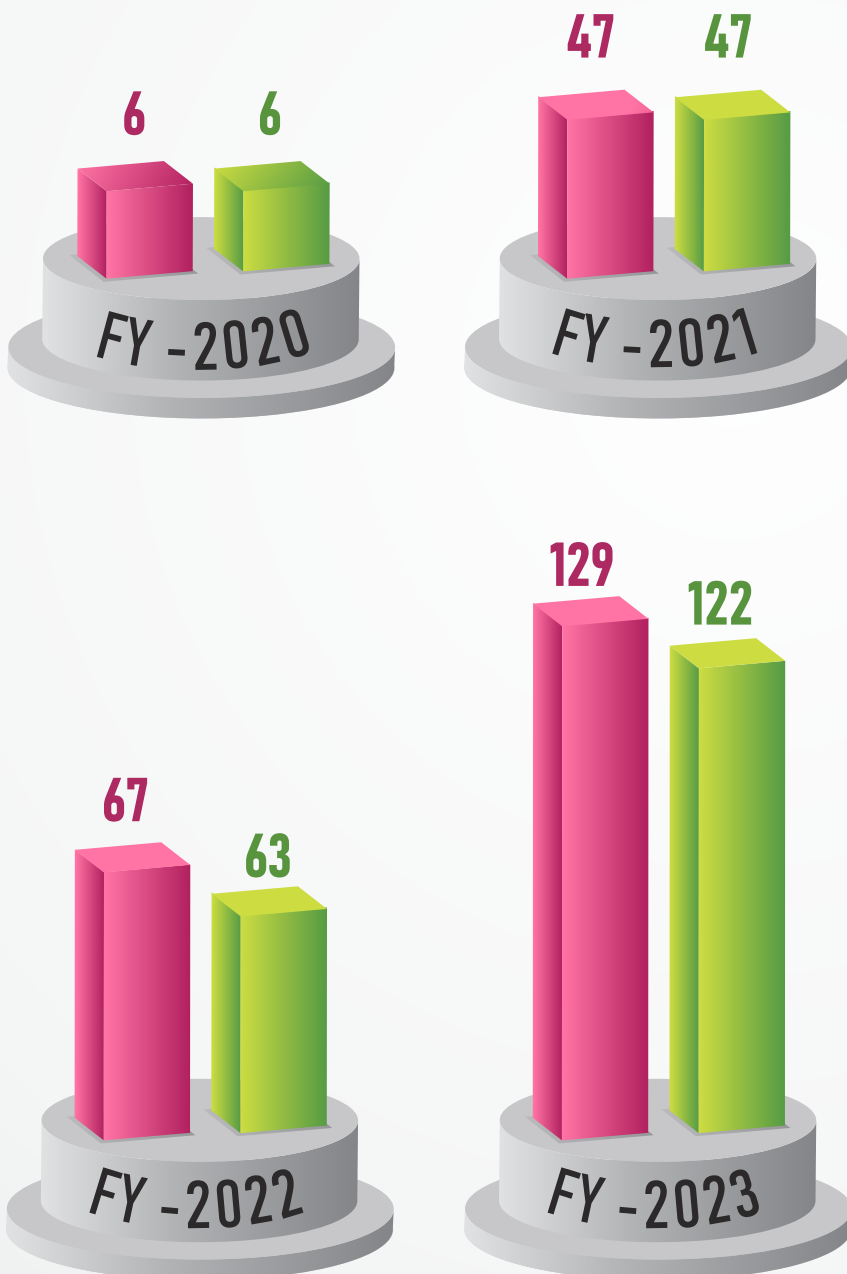

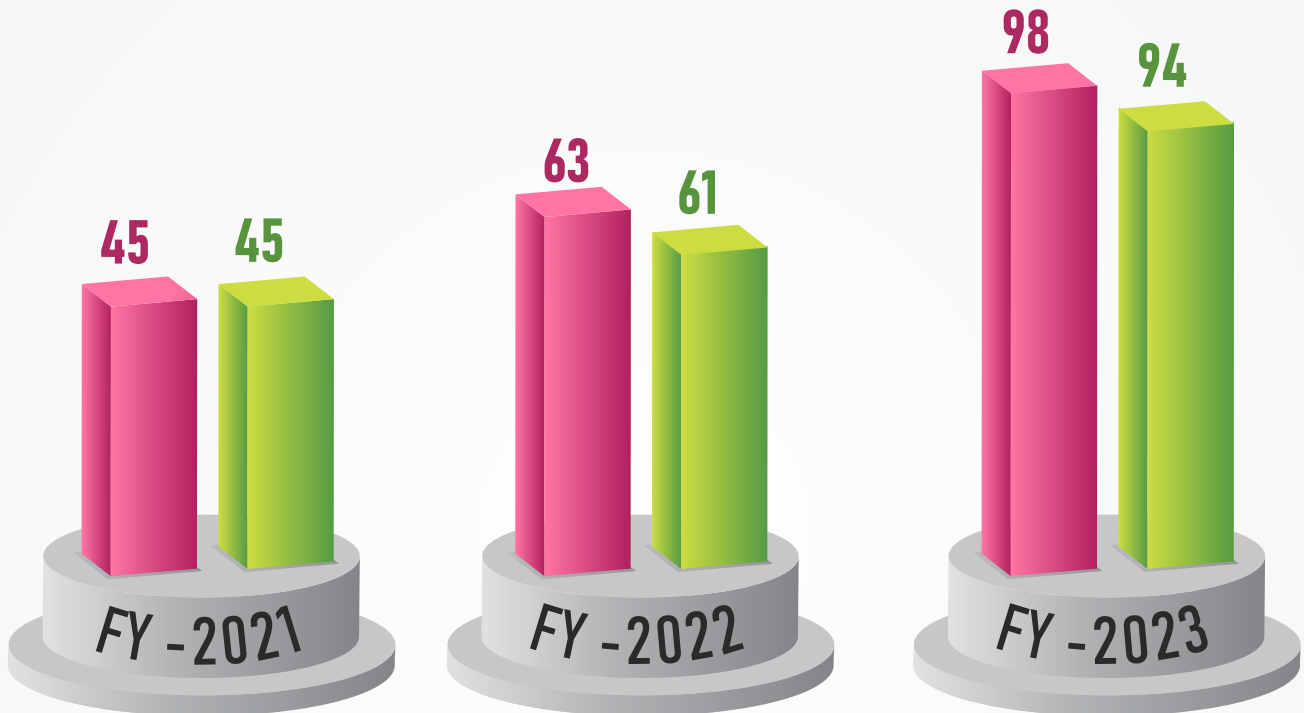

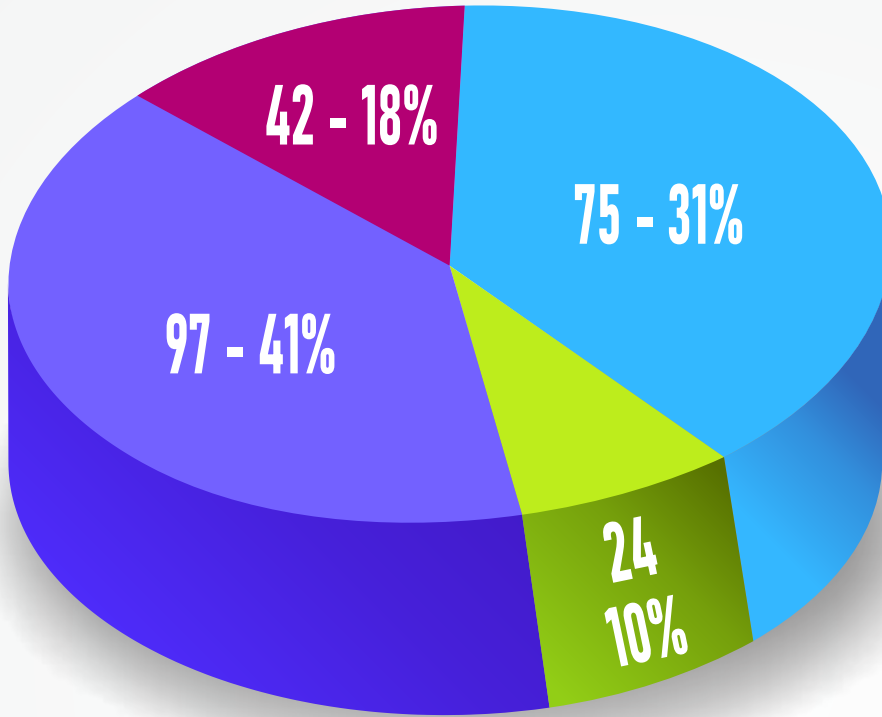

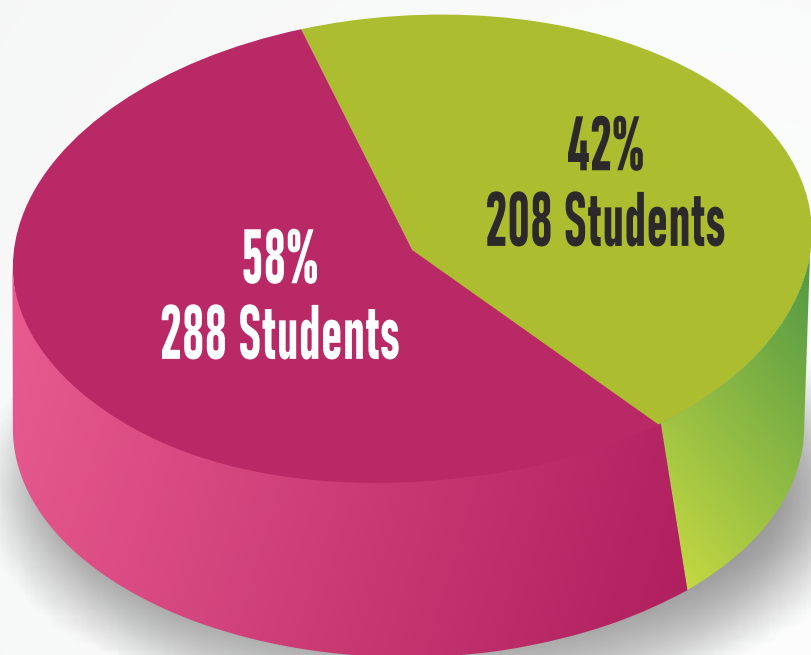

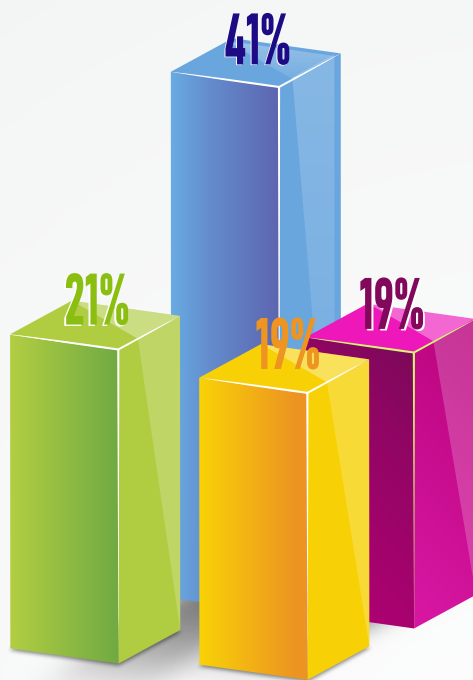


EXPENDITURE BY CATEGORY: 2018-23

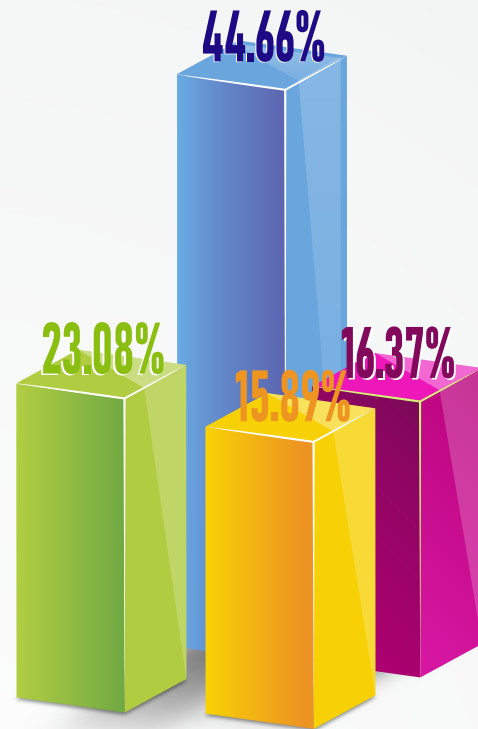

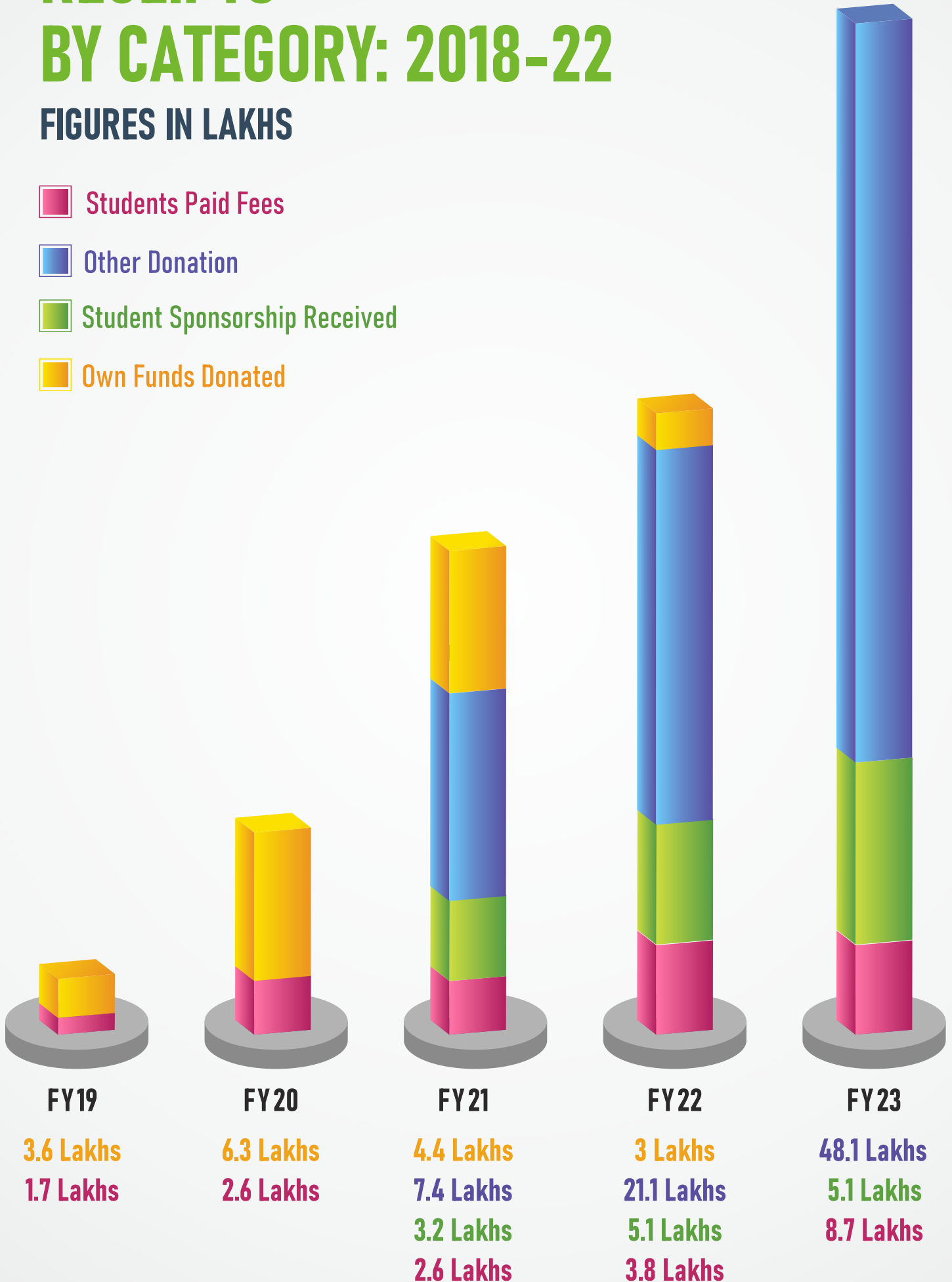

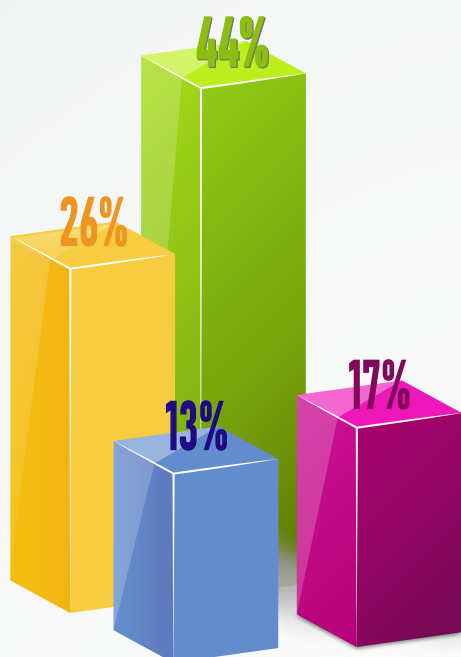

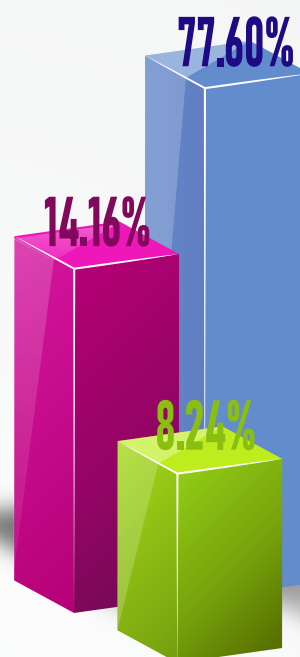
